Call for Oral or Symposium Presentations

HEALTH Research Institute

At the University of Houston HEALTH Research Institute, our primary mission is to conduct cutting-edge research that informs novel prevention, early detection, diagnosis, and intervention strategies that mitigate a broad range of health challenges.

The inaugural HEALTH: A Call to Action conference hosted by the HEALTH Research Institute invites researchers and health professionals to submit proposals for oral or symposium presentations. The goal is to provide a venue to share research findings, present captivating arguments for future directions of research or healthcare practices, and discuss alternative solutions and interpretations on health equity science. All submissions will be evaluated on the basis of scientific merit by peer review.

Presentation topics that address health disparities or provide innovative insights into health-equity science are preferred with additional prioritization given to areas such as cancer, diabetes, mental health, obesity, population health, precision medicine, social determinants of health, substance use/abuse, and access to care. Moreover, presentations that provide guidance regarding novel prevention, early detection, diagnosis, treatment, and/or dissemination and implementation strategies for our underserved communities are encouraged.

Submission Guidelines

Symposium Application Components:

- Presenters' Information (3-4 Presenters)
- Individual Abstracts (Title and Body)
- Abstract Authors
- Funding (if applicable)
- Symposium Title
- Symposium Summary
- 3 Learning Objectives for the Audience
- Identify the Moderator to introduce speakers, keep track of time, generate questions for the Q&A (Moderator can be a presenter).
- Attachments: All Presenters must submit a CV, Resume, or NIH biosketch.

Symposium Layout:

- 1-hour presentation
- 50 minutes of presentation content
- 10 minutes for Q&A

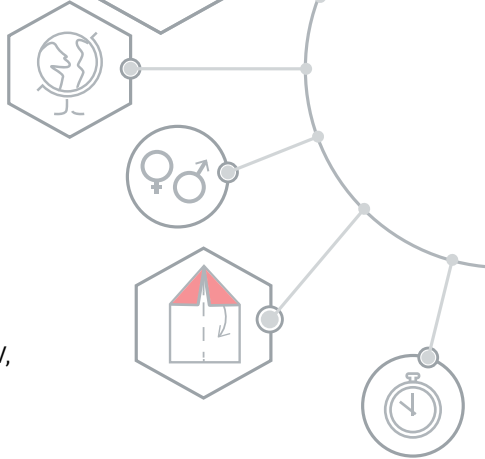

Oral Presentation Layout:

- 1-hour presentation
- 50 minutes of presentation content
- 10 minutes for Q&A

Application text requirements:

1. Character maximums
 - a. Titles: 85 characters
 - b. Abstract Body and Presentation Summaries: 2,500 characters
2. All submissions must be in English with no embedded symbols, and may not include charts, graphs, tables or references.
